RESADA counselors do practice psychotherapy. Our treatment methods are educational in nature using lectures, video tapes, audio tapes, and other visual aids. In addition, we utilize group counseling and individual counseling techniques. All techniques are cognitive behavioral change oriented.

You are entitled to receive information from us about our methods of instruction, counseling techniques, and fee structure. Please ask, if you would like to receive this information.

You can seek a second opinion, from one of our CAC III counselors, about our techniques. If you are voluntarily admitted to the program you can terminate your treatment at any time.

In a professional relationship, such as ours, sexual intimacy between a counselor and a client is never appropriate. If sexual intimacy occurs, it should be reported immediately to our Clinical Supervisor and/or the Executive Director. You also have the right to report this to one of the above-mentioned agencies.

Generally speaking, the information provided by and to a client during counseling sessions is legally confidential. If the information is legally confidential; the counselor cannot be forced to disclose the information without the client's consent.

There are exceptions to this confidentiality listed in 42 CFR Part 2 of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services regulations pertaining to Confidentiality of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Patient Records and in the Colorado Revised Statutes (12-45-216) and in the 1996 Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). You will be advised of these exceptions during the confidentiality advisement session upon your admission to the program.
